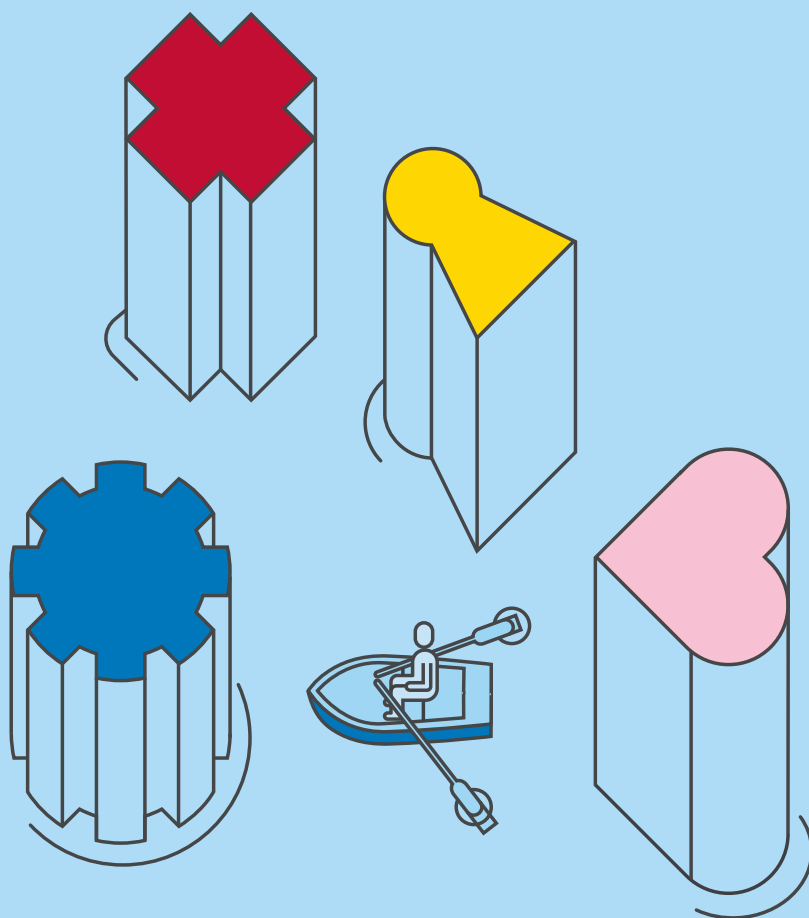


Complex welfare services in Nordic countries





The Nordic countries have some of the world's most developed welfare systems. Yet some people still fall through the cracks. Those at greatest risk are individuals requiring coordinated efforts from multiple actors. The challenges are remarkably similar in the Nordic countries, despite differences in organization and legislation.

The Nordic network for complex welfare services is an arena for reflection, discussion and knowledge sharing on the persistent problems of structuring and coordinating complex welfare services while exploring possible ways forward. The network has highlighted challenges affecting individuals depending on support from multiple actors. Municipalities and national actors have contributed to the work.
